Working together for a safer London



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'PRANKED', 'CONSEQUENCES' and 'JAG AND JILL' are our short Anti-Knife Crime films aimed at Year 6 primary school pupils. The films (part of Hounslow Council's and Mayor of London's Prevent strategy) aims to educate and Inform children about the dangers of knife crime and the devastating consequences it can have on young lives, families and communities.

For 2 weeks during June, we had over 3,000 primary school students across the borough of Hounslow watch these films in a workshop led by the Metropolitan Police. The children also tried a hand at singing our song 'Think Smart' at the Hounslow Citizen's Staying Safer event held at Cranford Community College.

It has been sent to all Hounslow primary schools to practice and then sing at the end of their Hounslow Citizen Day."

On Saturday 22nd June 2019 – We were invited by WSA Community and Local Trust to run two Big Local orkshops – Legacy and Youth Engagement at the Big Local London Learning Cluster Event held at St Luke's Community Centre. We were also ioined by several other Big Local areas across London including: Barnfield. Wick Award. Broad Green. Grange, Plaistow South and William Morris. In the morning session, our Chair Alan Fraser led the Legacy Workshop alongside Callum. Alan went through the work we've done so far to address the future and our legacy, including inviting young people to be part of the discussion. During the session. Alan helped other areas identify their goals, ambition and what they would like to be remembered for. In the afternoon session, Taz alongside Lavba Nisar, Callum Wills, Brooke Jones

and Kapil Lund led the Youth Engagement Workshop.

We lightly touched upon the work we've already done with young people and families and also went through a few case studies of our young people, We then asked the other areas a series of questions to help stimulate our discussion.

We asked the other areas to identify their current strength working and engaging young people and also the barriers and challenges they are facing. We were impressed with our youngsters at the event, they demonstrated fantastic confidence and inspired everyone with their enthusiasm and passion about the Big Local. We learned a lot from everyone else and left feeling excited.





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We had just over 150 people attend our Big Local Community Ramadan Iftar Event during half-term in May organised by our Incredible volunteers in just under a week.

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A PATHWAY TO VOLUNTEERING. OUR KIDS FUN CLUB PROVES TO BE A BIG HIT WITH LOCAL CHILDREN & PARENTS!

Two years ago we started our Kids Fun Club, a project led by parent volunteers at the Brabazon Community Centre. Eventually due to the popularity of the sessions, we moved to a bigger space at Berkeley Academy. In the past year we have engaged with 23 children including 8 parents and many of the children have also given up their time to give back to the community by volunteering for the Big Local. Each week we provide children with freshly prepared fruit, drinks and a few snacks. The children spend the first past of the session learning Spanish in a creative and fun way. They sing, dance and play games to help enhance their learning. After the Spanish, we play multi-sports led by our young volunteers – Mario Zapata and Biansha Kapoor. The club was founded by Alexandra Montoya, she has been incredible in leading the sessions for the last two years as a dedicated volunteer.

Alexandra said: "Kids Fun Club is a place where kids lay off some steam after a long week of hard work in the classroom, we have between 21 to 23 kids attending on a regular basis and they all love the fact we get to play games, sports and learn Spanish through songs. We hope to continue on to next year with help of parent volunteers. We just love our little community of young future volunteers."

We encourage children and parents to volunteer for the Big Local and this year we've had 11 children, their siblings and parents help us at two community clean up days and also our mural on the Redwood Estate.

BIG LOCAL VOLUNTEER INTERVIEW SHARANJIT KAUR

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Why I volunteer?

She joined our youth filmmaking club and soon after got involved with organising community events, activities and has helped recruit many new young people to our project. She is currently leading and running our Big Local Youth Public Speaking Club.

She is a positive role model and always seeking to improve and get involved. In April 2019, she won our community fashion award and recently spoke at LSE about her volunteering journey with us.

She is an outstanding young person.

I still remember that day when I was handing out roses at our Valentine's Clean-up in 2018. I went to this lady's house to give her a rose, when she opened the door she started crying because no one ever visited her before and she had felt left out. Her husband was unwell. When I handed her the flower, she said: "May God fulfil all of your wishes." I felt so touched and a voice came from within in which said: "You're doing the right thing."

What have been my experiences?

I never thought that I would volunteer with an organisation and come this far. 3 years ago, I became a volunteer for Heston West Big Local. The Big Local has taught me a lots of things in life. A few years ago, I was new in England, I was really shy and scared to talk in front of people. I started my journey being involved with the film club. The film club has been a great experience because I've learnt many new skills such as editing, presenting and script writing. Soon after I took the next step and I became a volunteer by getting involved with the Big Local Youth Action Team. Being part of the Big Local has helped me improve confidence. Heston West Big Local has allowed me to do things that I could never imagine such as speaking in Parliament.



What do I get out of volunteering?

Heston West Big Local has given me the platform to achieve my dreams and has made me a better person. The Big Local has encouraged me to create a path of my own. I don't want to be called a volunteer, I don't want to be called a student, I don't want to have a label. I WANT TO HAVE A LEGACY. I want to be known as someone who has goals and has achieved them and Heston West Big Local has supported me at each moment in my life. When I came to Heston West Big Local, I was so shy and had a low self esteem with 0% of confidence and now look at me. Years later, I am speaking to people, doing speeches in universities, in Parliament and leading my own public speaking project.



BIG LOCAL VOLUNTEER INTERVIEW CALLUM WILLS

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Callum is one of our first ever Big Local young volunteers, he started at 11 years old and has since been an instrumental and inspiring figure for the Heston West community.

Now 15 years old, his non-stop energy, passion for the community, charming and funny personality makes Callum, Callum! In 2018, Callum was awarded our Brian Clark Community Youth Leadership Award for his outstanding contribution for the Big Local.

Why I volunteer?

I like to talk and engage with people and volunteering for the Big Local allows me to get out of the house. I also enjoy making new friends, helping people in the community who needs things done, such as gardening and cleaning up. I am really helpful and I've been told I am really funny, however I can be serious and I can be a bit silly sometimes.

What have been my experiences?

Creating a Community Mural
